

Dual Enrollment/Career & College Promise Agreement

_____ is dual enrolled in college courses through Yadkin County Schools for the _____ school year.

I am aware of the following policies regarding dual enrollment:

- Students taking online classes are able to work off campus after receiving permission and turning in all required paperwork.
- Students and parents who provide their own transportation are responsible for any and all liability related to such transportation and are required to release the Yadkin County Board of Education and its employees and/or agents from such liability.
- The course grades will be calculated in the college and the high school GPA and will reflect on both the college and high school transcript.
- Dual enrollment classes do affect eligibility for athletic participation and driver's license requirements.
- Students must purchase their own books or kits if they are required for their class(es).

Yadkin County Schools College Course Withdrawal Policy:

- If a student drops a college course after the first 10 days of the course, the student will receive a WF on their high school transcript.
- If a student wishes to drop a college course within the 10-day high school add/drop window, the student may receive a W rather than a WF on the high school transcript IF there is evidence of the following:
 - The student has contacted his/her college instructor about the concerns of receiving credit for the course (self-advocacy from SCC Guidelines). The student must also be able to provide evidence of his/her self-advocacy.
 - The student has contacted the college liaison and the school principal regarding his/her concern for receiving credit for the course.
 - The student, the principal, school counselor (counselor has reviewed student transcript), and the parent/s agree the best decision is for the student to drop the course. This communication will be in writing. "Course Withdrawal" form must also be completed.
- If a student is administratively dropped by a college instructor, the student will receive a WF for the course. A student may appeal to receive a W instead of a WF if the student believes there are extreme, extenuating circumstances that led to the student being dropped from the course.
- After dropping one (1) course, students will be required to receive permission from the principal before being allowed to enroll in any additional college courses.
- A "W" on a student's high school transcript will not reflect in the GPA.
- A "WF" on a student's high school transcript will reflect as a 59% in the GPA.
