- Requirements to be CCP eligible:
 - must be a junior or senior
 - have an unweighted GPA of 2.8
 - OR demonstrate college readiness on an assessment or placement test for English, Reading, and Math
 - complete any prerequisite high school courses (Example: Carpentry 1 and Carpentry 2 in order to take Construction Technology)

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


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
